From the Pastor's Desk

“What do you think? If a man owns a hundred sheep, and one of them wanders away, will he not leave the ninety-nine on the hills and go to look for the one that wandered off?” (Matthew 18:12)

On the walls outside the sanctuary are four canvas photos of Carrollton. About six months ago, we were working on updating our foyer and I was pondering ideas of different things we could put on the walls. On a whim, I asked a member of Redeemer with a penchant for photography if she had any photos of Carrollton she liked. While she did not have any photos on hand, she did like the idea and took a day to explore Carrollton and take some photos. After sorting through dozens of pictures she took, we decided on four of our favorites and had them printed on canvas. They are now hanging outside the sanctuary.

It is easy to think of a sanctuary as a refuge from the outside world. After all, one definition of the word sanctuary means **“a refuge or asylum.”** **There are times I hope Redeemer’s sanctuary is a refuge from the outside world.** It should be a place to put the pressing

concerns of a non-stop world on hold and focus on the God of peace. It should be a place where the upside-down values of this world are rejected in favor of the hope of Jesus Christ. But our sanctuary is not solely about escaping this world. Christ has given us the commission to go out into the world to make disciples. And since Christ has not yet returned, there is still work to do.

I hope that when you enter the sanctuary you are overwhelmed with the presence and peace of God. I hope that the sanctuary is a refuge for you. But I also hope that the



pictures outside the sanctuary would remind you of a city – Carrollton – that God loves deeply. Enjoy the peace of the sanctuary, but do not neglect the search for those who are lost.




We are Thankful for Our Pastors and Staff!

Angel Tree Ministry is Returning to Redeemer

This year marks the second year Redeemer will be partnering with *Angel Tree*, a program of Prison Fellowship, to provide a pathway toward the redemption, reconciliation, and restoration of children and families who have been impacted by crime.

Angel Tree Christmas works to connect parents in prison with their children through the delivery of Christmas gifts given on the parent's behalf. It is an opportunity to begin a relationship with a local family that has been broken by crime leaving a child without a parent at Christmas.

Those incarcerated parents who wish to participate in the program personally fill out an application for their child and select the general type of gift they would like their child to receive. Those names and gift suggestions will be displayed in the foyer on Sunday, November 29th.

Making a difference in the life of a local family will be as easy as 1-2-3:

1. Church members select a child's name from the Angel Tree in the foyer beginning November 29th.



2. Members contact the child's caregiver and confirm their participation in the program and that the gift selected would be a good gift for the child.
3. Members purchase new toys (costing \$20-\$25), wrap and deliver presents with a loving message from the incarcerated parent between December 20th-24th.

- Driving to deliver gifts for members who are unable to deliver the gift's themselves
