Now finish the work, so that your eager willingness to do it may be matched by your completion of it, according to your means. 2 Corinthians 8:11

This December you will see a special envelope in your worship bulletin marked "Mortgage Offering". Throughout this month we are collecting a special offering to pay down our mortgage debt. For anyone who doesn't know the story, our mortgage has been hanging over our heads for over two decades. It began with the purchase of our land in 1991. While we love our church building, unfortunately the mortgage has hounded us since 1991. We had to re-finance two times in the past 20 years and our pay-off date was extended farther and farther out. The last refinancing was in 2007 we were not set to be paid off until November 2027.

God is faithful and this year we were presented with an opportunity to sell 3.5 of our 7 acres of land to help pay down the mortgage. With the sale in May, our mortgage dropped from \$600,000 to \$160,000. In addition, we have continued to pay the old monthly payment (\$5,150) rather than the re-amortized amount (\$1,500) meaning


each month over \$4,600 gets knocked off our mortgage bill! As I write this, our mortgage currently sits at \$130,000. Even better news: there are still proceeds from the sale (\$25,000) that will be applied to our mortgage in January.

Now is the time to finish strong. We are looking at the mortgage being paid off in a matter of months, not years. Every

little bit helps and once the mortgage is gone, we get to re-purpose \$5,000 toward ministry.

As a healing church, I recognize that money – especially feeling

in the third grade for my elementary theatre group and got my first lead role in a musical in the fifth grade... which was

horrifying! I hated singing. Acting allowed me to break out of my shell, but singing made me want to crawl back in it. I only sang when I had to at church or in plays. And, honestly, I was never very good at it. When I became a senior in high school I heard a song sung by CiCi Winnans and thought, "I could sing like that."

God had to have planted that thought in my head, because I had never sung like

that in my life. But, for whatever reason, I knew that God wanted to use me. I started singing in an African American choir that year. I learned a lot from that experience and went to college where I took voice lessons and studied theatre.

I went to college at UNT in Denton. While there, I sang on the praise team at Redeemer. After leaving UNT, I moved back to East Texas where I managed a furniture store for two years. I was never able to find a church family that I loved and that showed me love as much as Redeemer. I had a good job, a nice apartment and had started acting in film and TV. But I missed my church family. Bill and Nancy Donley must have sensed my loneliness from hundreds of miles away, because in 2007 Mr.D started bugging me about moving back to the Dallas area to attend church at Redeemer. After a series of God -driven events, I was able to move back. I am now pursuing an acting career and leading worship at Redeemer Covenant Church. I consider myself blessed to be doing the two things I love the most. Very blessed! Just like when I knew God wanted to use the voice I didn't know I had, I knew that God would give me the tools I

needed to lead a worship team though I had no idea how He would do it. He had planted the desire in my heart to lead music long before I came back to Redeemer. I really believe God was preparing Redeemer for me as much as He was preparing me for Redeemer. Through not having a praise team leader, God was using Redeemer members to create dedicated leaders within the church. When I got here, all I had to do was organize and create a system. The talent and leadership were already in place.

It's amazing how God prepares us to do His will. For me, as embarrassing as it was when I was given solos as a child, God was preparing my voice. As much as I did not enjoy managing a furniture store in East Texas God was preparing me to manage a praise team. And though spending two years without a church family was hard, God used that time to make me understand my desire for leading worship. I thank God for those uncomfortable situations. They led me to exactly where He wanted me to be. And to a church that I will always consider family.

The Advent Wreath Tradition

The season of Advent takes place during the four Sundays prior to Christmas.

Advent means "arrival of a notable person or event" and we use the season of Advent to prepare ourselves for Christ's birth. We have many traditions and many activities to help us do that: singing Christmas carols,

decorating the church, joyful activities together like the Advent Dinner, a Christmas play, ornament exchange, and so on. Our prayer is that we do not get wrapped up in the activities and lose the spiritual importance of the season. To help us focus our hearts, each worship service we will light a new candle in the Advent Wreath, symbolizing hope, peace, joy, and love. Then on December 25th (or at our Christmas Eve service), we light the Christ Candle symbolizing the birth of Christ, the Light of the World and the Prince of Peace. We will also have a series of Advent prayers on the back of the Sunday bulletins to help us prepare our hearts for the coming of our King!

Why the purple and pink candles? Early in the history of the church, Lent was set aside as a season of fasting and prayer to remember the crucifixion of Jesus. The traditional color of Lenten banners was a deep purple, signifying royalty, repentance, and suffering. Churches lit

seven candles, one for each week of the solemn season. To signify the promise of hope and joy of **Christ's coming resurrection, on the third Sunday of** Lent, the church was encouraged not to fast, but to feast, and the priests wore pink vestments as a reminder of the coming joy. When the season of Advent was instituted, the church viewed it as a mini-Lent, a time for reflection and repentance (thus the purple). So the first four candles of Lent were adopted and the third candle of Advent was pink in honor of the Lenten tradition of coming joy. Each **candle was named in anticipation for all that Christ's** coming would bring: hope, peace, joy, and love.

- \$20 maximum per family



Angel Tree Program Now in Progress!

November 29 - December 23

What is Angel Tree?

It is a program of Prison Fellowship to provide a pathway toward redemption, reconciliation, and restoration of children and families affected by crime. Angel Tree

"I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me." Matthew 25:36

Christmas works to connect parents in prison with their children through the delivery of Christmas gifts given on the parent's behalf. It is an opportunity to begin a relationship with a local family that has been broken

by crime, leaving a child without a parent at Christmas.

How does it work?

Incarcerated parents who wish to participate in the program personally fill out an application for their child and select the general type of gift they would like their child to receive. Those names and gift suggestions are forwarded to Redeemer and are hung on the Angel Tree that will be in the lobby on Sunday, November 30.

Making a difference in the life of a local family will be as easy as 1-2-3:

- 1. Church members select a child's name from the Angel Tree in the foyer beginning November 30th.
- 2. Members will then contact the child's caregiver and confirm their participation in the program and that the gift selected would be a good gift for the child.

3. Members purchase new toys (costing \$20-\$25), wrap, and deliver presents with a loving message from the incarcerated parent between December 21st-23rd

How can I be involved, besides buying a gift?

We would like to have volunteers to help with:

- Helping create Angel Tree Tags
- Contacting and confirming participation of the families
- Driving to deliver gifts for members who are unable to deliver the gift's themselves
- Pray for the families who will be touched by this ministry.

Celebrate Recovery's 8 Principles of Recovery

Celebrate Recovery focuses on eight principles that are based on the Beatitudes and pairs them with 12 Steps to recovery. The eight principles are as follows:

1. Realize I'm not God: I admit that I am powerless to control my tendency to do the wrong thing and my life is unmanageable. (Step 1)

"Happy are those who know they are spiritually poor." Matthew 5:3

2. Earnestly believe that God exists, that I matter to Him, and that He has the power to help me recover. (Step 2)

"Happy are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted." Mathew 5:4

3. Consciously choose to commit all my life and will to Christ's care and control. (Step 3)

"Happy are the meek." Matthew 5:5

4. Openly examine and confess my faults to myself, to God, and to someone I trust. (Steps 4 & 5)

"Happy are the pure in heart." Matthew 5:8

5. Voluntarily submit to every change God wants to make in my life and humbly ask Him to remove my character defects. (Steps 6 & 7)

6. Evaluate all my relationships. Offer forgiveness to those who have hurt me and make amends for harm I've done to others, except when to do so would harm them or others. (Steps 8 & 9)

"Happy are the merciful." "Happy are the peacemakers." Matthew 5:7, 9

7. Reserve a daily time with God for self-examination, Bible reading, and prayer in order to know God and His will for my life and to gain the power to follow His will. (Steps 10 & 11)

8. Yield myself to God to be used to bring this Good News to others, both by my example and by my words. (Step 12)
