From the Pastor's Desk

But Jesus would not entrust Himself to them, for He knew all people. (John 2:24)

"I am not coming." With that sentence, Stanley Hauerwas's life changed.

Hauerwas, a theology professor at Duke University, had been married for 24 years to a woman who struggled with mental illness. Throughout the years she attempted to seduce his co-workers in front of him, spent their retirement money, and eventually abandoned him and their son by running away to marry someone else. Yet each time her schemes failed she would call home asking for his help. Thinking it was his Christian duty, Hauerwas would come running back to her. Finally, when he realized he was not a helpful Christian but rather a pawn in a terrible cycle, he uttered that sentence - "I am not coming."

A mentor of mine defines co-dependency as "enabling people to continue to operate in a dysfunctional way." It happens when we Christians would rather be nice than be honest. It happens when we secretly enjoy being better than or being needed by someone else, rather

than help them change. It happens when we are afraid to say no. Sure, there is always the danger of using the word 'no' for self-centered purposes. But as the verse above from John chapter 2 shows, even Jesus knew the value of taking a step back and saying 'no' at times.

The next sermon series is titled "No is Not a Four Letter Word." It fits with our yearlong theme – Saying No in Order to Say Yes. We will focus specifically on

three main areas of life: time, money, and people. I would encourage you to pray



about this. Are you always short on time? Do you think more money will solve all your problems? Do you gather with family or friends only to have the same insecurities pop up? No is not a four letter word. Especially when it leads to saying yes to Christ.



Midsouth Covenant Camp is a summer camp organized by the Midsouth Conference of the Evangelical Covenant Church.

The Primary Goal of the camp is to expose each camper to the love and saving power of Jesus Christ.

The Location is in Grapeland, TX, where we rent Frontier Camp. (www.frontiercamp.org)

Student Camper Ages: entering grades 2 through 9 with programs tailored to their age in grade level groups of 2-4, 5-6, and 7-9.

They attend special CILT training sessions while at camp and participate in regular cabin and camp activities where they get "hands on"



Missions Emphasis

As Christians, we are all called to be missionaries, no matter who we are. One of our missions team members, Ray Utterback, shares these thoughts with us on being part of God's mission:

"The Lord moves throughout history fulfilling His purpose so ultimately mission is not a response to human need, but pursuit of God's purpose. Mission should not be viewed as a matter of volunteerism or opportunism; rather, those who become involved in mission activity understand that their efforts are contributing to God's global purpose.

While Christian mission invariably responds to human need, it is the reality of God's purpose that helps Christians avoid the absurdity of being self-sent by their own convictions and compassion.

Unless the outcome of mission is seen as bringing about something valuable for God, mission is reduced to an enterprise which benefits people. If we allow mission to be defined in these terms, then it can be misunderstood as strictly a matter of responding to human needs and becomes a matter of mobilizing human resources to meet human needs. True mission is from God, through God and back to Him again. As groups of people come to glorify and obey Christ, they find that His governance brings genuine transformation and God's intended justice to their communities.

God does not use people, instead He invites people to become more closely related to Him as they join Him in mission. God invites people to join Him in mission and empowers them to carry out His purpose Understand that mission obedience is never a condition of God's love. Instead, God's call to mission, is a high dignity and privilege for those who respond.

It's important to understand that God's mission is always greater than the mission task He has given people to complete. God working though His people in a personal and relational way brings intimacy and dignity in the mission task. Through God, His people pursue promised destiny instead of merely laboring to perform duty."
