From the Pastor's Desk

You know with all your heart and soul that not one of all the good promises the Lord your God gave you has failed. (Joshua 23:14)

Have you ever taken a blue-water challenge in your spiritual life? I heard the term "blue-water challenge" from a pastor in Hawaii named Jordan Seng. The term comes from the navy.

"Brown-water" missions refer to missions that are close to the shore or in lakes or rivers where the water is not deep.

"Blue-water" missions refer to missions in the middle of the ocean where if trouble occurs there is no safe place to swim to.

Pastor Seng's belief is that all too often churches pursue "brown-water" goals.

These are goals that are always "shallow" enough so that if we fail we can save ourselves. Or they are goals that are "safe" enough for us to think we can accomplish them without God's help. In contrast to "brown-water" goals, Pastor Seng pushes his congregation toward "blue-water" goals. These are the goals that a church knows it could never reach on its own; the church must be totally reliant on God. There is no safety net except God.

On September 28th we attempted a blue-water goal. We tried to transform our Harvest Sunday into a community picnic for apartment buildings nearby. I say "attempted" because I write this on September 20th, and I have no idea how things turned out. But I can tell you that in the process leading up to the 28th, every step of the way has been totally dependent on God. Would we get into the apartments? Would we get enough people?



How would the day turn out? We have taken all questions on faith.

I do hope that no matter what happened on the 28th, this community picnic would be a start toward taking more blue-water steps of faith as a church. Not only that – I want to encourage each of you as well. It isn't any fun to be in the middle of the ocean. But God does His best work when we are totally reliant on Him. Whatever you are going through, you serve a "blue-water" God.





New This Year: Angel Tree

This year marks the first year Redeemer will be partnering with Angel Tree, a program of Prison Fellowship, to provide a pathway toward the redemption, reconciliation and restoration of children and families who have been impacted by crime.

Angel Tree Christmas works to connect parents in prison with their children through the delivery of Christmas gifts given on the parent's behalf. It is an opportunity to begin a relationship with a local family that has been broken by crime leaving a child without a parent at Christmas.

Those incarcerated parents who wish to participate in the program personally fill out an application for their child and select the general type of gift they would like their child to receive. Those names and gift suggestions will be displayed in the foyer on Sunday, November 30th.

Making a difference in the life of a local family will be as easy as 1-2-3:

1. Church members select a child's name from the Angel Tree in the foyer beginning November 30th.



2. Members contact the child's caregiver and confirm their participation in the program and that the gift selected would be a good gift for the child.
3. Members purchase new toys (costing \$20-\$25), wrap and deliver presents with a loving message from the incarcerated parent between December 21st-23rd.

You can be a part of this opportunity by:

- Contacting and confirming participation of the families
- Helping create Angel Tree Tags
- Driving to deliver gifts for members who are unable to deliver the gift's themselves

Also, please pray in advance for the families who will be touched by this ministry. Thanks!



The arrangement of the four figures results in a cross-like pattern, representative of the center of our faith. The center circle symbolizes the unity and the bond of fellowship which we call "the **Covenant.**"
