For instance, we were encouraged to hold a sonogram party and invite all of our friends over to play sonogram **themed games (we didn't).** **Babies R Us put together a "must-have" list for the baby** – even though if I purchased everything on the list, I would have no room in my house left. Our hospital offers a special suite that Jessica can deliver the baby in, followed by a romantic catered dinner for our new family – for a fee of course.

God probably would have disappointed

the people at Babies R Us. When Jesus was born there were no sonogram parties, only a midnight announcement to Mary and Joseph about the unexpected pregnancy. There was no baby shower unless you count some mangy shepherds and some random kings. (And not one of them purchased a bouncer for baby Jesus!) And certainly there was no fancy suite to deliver the baby in. One might conclude that God is something of a dead-beat father, but you and I both know the real story – God just knows what is truly important and what is not.

This will be my last opportunity to remind **each of you to 'Say no in order to say yes'.** What a fitting season to ponder that idea. The most important thing that happens this Christmas is that Christ is here. While I hope you celebrate this season with gifts, food, and family, I also hope you keep in mind what truly matters. Give yourself permission to say no to things in order to say yes to the gift of Christ.

requests, and propose a budget for 2015 to the church council. Then, at the January congregational meeting, the church council will provide a financial report and propose the new budget for church members to vote on.

Advent at Redeemer

The season of Advent takes place during the four Sundays prior to Christmas. Advent means “arrival of a notable person or event” and we use the season of Advent to prepare ourselves for Christ’s birth. We have many traditions and many activities to help us do that: singing Christmas carols, decorating the church, joyful activities together like the Advent Dinner, a Christmas play, ornament exchange, and so on. Our prayer is that we do not get wrapped up in the activities and lose the spiritual importance of the season. To help us focus our hearts, each worship service we will light a new candle in the Advent Wreath, symbolizing hope, peace, joy, and love. Then on December 25th (or at our Christmas Eve service), we will light the Christ Candle symbolizing the birth of Christ - the Light of the World and the Prince of Peace. We will also have a series of Advent prayers on the back of the Sunday bulletins to help us prepare our hearts for the coming of our King!

The Advent Wreath Tradition

Why the Pink Candle? I (Pastor Mark) was perplexed this year when I went to get Advent Candles. The set had 3 purple candles and one pink candle. I had not seen that before and thought maybe I got a defective package. However, I found out the pink candle is intentional. See this article from the House Church Network Association (www.hcna.us):



Now, why the pink candle? In the earliest years of the church the only church season was Lent, the seven weeks prior to Easter. Lent was a season of fasting and prayer as the church commemorated the crucifixion of Jesus. The traditional color of banners in the church during this time was a deep purple, signifying royalty, repentance, and suffering. During Lent the church lit seven candles, one for each week of the solemn season. However solemn the season, the story of Lent also has a twinge of hope and joy since the death of Christ prefigured the resurrection. So, on the third Sunday of Lent, the church was encouraged not to fast, but to feast. In ancient times on this

particular Sunday the Pope would honor a citizen with a pink rose, and as time passed the priests wore pink vestments on this day as a reminder of the coming joy. When the season of Advent was instituted the church viewed it as a mini-Lent, a time for reflection and repentance (thus the purple). In so doing, the church adopted

the first four candles of Lent and changed the third candle of Advent to pink in honor of the Lenten tradition. This is why we have a pink candle in our Advent Wreaths.

To further heighten the sense of anticipation of Christ's coming during Advent, the church named each candle in the wreath -- the first being hope, the second peace, the third joy, and the fourth love (there are a number of other traditional names as well, though these are some of the most ancient). It has always seemed fitting to me that the pink candle is the candle of joy, the one that speaks to us with its twinge of color.

Angel Tree Program Now in Progress!

November 30 - December 23

What is Angel Tree?

It is a program of Prison Fellowship to provide a pathway toward redemption, reconciliation, and restoration of children and families affected by crime. Angel Tree

*"I needed clothes
and you clothed me,
I was sick
and you looked after me,
I was in prison
and you came to visit me."
Matthew 25:36*

Christmas works to connect parents in prison with their children through the delivery of Christmas gifts given on the parent's behalf. It is an opportunity to begin a relationship with a local family that has been broken

by crime, leaving a child without a parent at Christmas.

How does it work?

Incarcerated parents who wish to participate in the program personally fill out an application for their child and select the general type of gift they would like their child to receive. Those names and gift suggestions are forwarded to Redeemer and are hung on the Angel Tree that will be in the lobby on Sunday, November 30.

Making a difference in the life of a local family will be as easy as 1-2-3:

1. Church members select a child's name from the Angel Tree in the foyer beginning November 30th.
2. Members will then contact the child's caregiver and confirm their participation in the program and that the gift selected would be a good gift for the child.

3. Members purchase new toys (costing \$20-\$25), wrap, and deliver presents with a loving message from the incarcerated parent between December 21st-23rd.



How can I be involved, besides buying a gift?

We would like to have volunteers to help with:

- Helping create Angel Tree Tags
- Contacting and confirming participation of the families
- Driving to deliver gifts for members who are unable to deliver the gift's themselves
- Pray for the families who will be touched by this ministry.

Celebrate Recovery's 8 Principles of Recovery

Our fall sermon series has been based on Celebrate Recovery's eight principles of recovery. These principles are based on the Beatitudes and follow the 12 steps from Alcoholics Anonymous. They are as follows:

1. **Realize I'm not God: I admit that I am powerless to control my tendency to do the wrong thing and my life is unmanageable. (Step 1)**

"Happy are those who know they are spiritually poor."
Matthew 5:3

2. **Earnestly believe that God exists, that I matter to Him, and that He has the power to help me recover. (Step 2)**

"Happy are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted." Mathew 5:4

3. **Consciously choose to commit all my life and will to Christ's care and control. (Step 3)**

"Happy are the meek." Matthew 5:5

4. **Openly examine and confess my faults to myself, to God, and to someone I trust. (Steps 4 & 5)**

"Happy are the pure in heart." Matthew 5:8

5. **Voluntarily submit to every change God wants to make in my life and humbly ask Him to remove my character defects. (Steps 6 & 7)**

"Happy are those whose greatest desire is to do what God requires." Matthew 5:6

6. **Evaluate all my relationships. Offer forgiveness to those who have hurt me and make amends for harm I've done to others, except when to do so would harm them or others. (Steps 8 & 9)**

"Happy are the merciful." "Happy are the peacemakers."
Matthew 5:7, 9

7. **Reserve a daily time with God for self-examination, Bible reading, and prayer in order to know God and His will for my life and to gain the power to follow His will. (Steps 10 & 11)**

8. **Yield myself to God to be used to bring this Good News to others, both by my example and by my words. (Step 12)**
