From the Pastor's Desk

"Each one should test their own actions. Then they can take pride in themselves alone, without comparing themselves to someone else, for each one should carry their own load." Galatians 6:5

"Outsource" is a polarizing term in our society. Outsource is defined as "To obtain goods or service from an outside or foreign supplier, especially in place of an internal supplier." To some it conjures up images of a hard working individual losing their job to some nameless place overseas. Others see it as a way of life in this new globalized world – a burden off their backs taken care of by someone else. However you feel about it, outsourcing is a reality of our world. Stories of outsourcing occur each week in the business section of the newspaper. Believe it or not, outsourcing is taking place in the church as well. Like the business world, sometimes it is good and sometimes it is bad. Outsourcing our prayer requests or burdens (sharing them with another) is good. But other parts of our 'faith outsourcing' are bad. We hope others will take responsibility for

nurturing our children's faith. We blame a tepid worship service on the songs or the sermon rather than check our own attitudes before we walk into the sanctuary. We expect someone else to do the evangelizing, the caring, or the giving. Yet come judgment day, the Bible says that we have to give an account

for OUR behavior, not anyone else's.



For the season of Lent at Redeemer we are going to be taking outsourcing head on. We are going to ask the question – what parts of our faith have we been guilty of handing over to others? Is it our worship? Our spiritual gifts? The opportunities we alone have? The Gospel teaches us that God wants to use each of us for His Kingdom. We cannot outsource that truth to someone else.

Congregational Meeting Report


January 31, 2016, 12:50 P.M. We accomplished a lot at this year's January Congregational Meeting.

We voted on and approved two motions that were brought to the church by Council:

Motion 1: Constitutional Bylaw Change Regarding Church Financial Audit.

The Motion: That Bylaw Article VII, Section 5 will be deleted from Redeemer Covenant Church's constitution and be replaced with the following bylaw:

"The accounts of Redeemer Evangelical Covenant Church of Dallas, Texas shall be audited every four years by an external auditing service. The audit service shall be selected by the church council. The congregation shall be notified of the audit and the audited reports shall be made available at the following congregational business meeting"

Motion 2: Prohibition of Open Carry on Redeemer's Property:

The Motion: In response to Texas Section 30.07 ("Open Carry") Redeemer Covenant Church prohibits any person from entering with a hand-gun that is carried openly.

We recognized the work Denis Lemay has done to standardize the specifications of what we need for our landscaping plans. Marlin Landscaping will begin the initial project of irrigation for the building and trees.

Jayme Wright gave our financial/giving report and Deb Christopher presented the 2016 proposed budget, which was approved. (Copies are available in the foyer.)

Update on our mortgage: We used the \$34,000 surplus to pay down the mortgage. If we stick to the budget, our mortgage will be paid off in December 2016!

O SOUP



2 ½ pounds baby red potatoes, sliced into small bite sized pieces

½ regular package uncooked bacon, finely diced

(can also use salt pork)

1 medium onion, diced

¼ bunch celery, diced

8 cups milk

4 cups water



4 chicken bouillon cubes (use a cup of the hot potato water to dissolve, then use the cup of hot water in place of one of the above cups of water)

1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon black pepper

34 cup salted butter

34 cup flour

¼ bunch freshly chopped parsley

1 cup whipping cream (can use evaporated milk)

DIRECTIONS:

In large pot, boil potatoes in water 10 minutes. Drain and set aside. In sauté pan, cook bacon until crisp. Drain bacon fat and place bacon on paper towel over plate to drain more. Add onion and celery to bacon pan and cook over medium-high heat until celery is tender, about 5 minutes. To the large potato pan, add milk, water, bullion, salt and pepper. Cook over medium-high heat until mixture is very hot, about 8 minutes, stirring often. Do not let mixture boil. In small, heavy saucepan melt butter. Add flour and mix well. Cook over medium-low heat until mixture bubbles, stirring 2 to 3 minutes to make a roux. While constantly stirring soup, add roux slowly until soup is thick and creamy, about 4 minutes. Stir in parsley, reserved potatoes, and cream. Garnish with cheese, bacon bits, onions or all three. Serve hot!

2015 was also another year of growth for the praise team. Redeemer uses congregation of all ages to worship. I feel like God has used Redeemer as a "seed planting" church at times. Sometimes we experience the fruit of

our labors and sometimes we do not. In 2015 I was continually reminded of the importance of encouraging talented new musicians and singers. How? In 2015 we welcomed onto our praise team some amazing musicians who are seasoned and

have abundant talent. I am so thankful to God for the churches and people that played a role in these musicians' lives so that they can use their well trained and amazing talents at Redeemer. These musicians are the product of seeds that were planted elsewhere. May we all be encouraged to plant seeds. Water them, care for them, but be open to the plan God has for them and for us.

In 2016 some goals I would like to see us accomplish are, first of all, continue to find ways to allow the worship at Redeemer to be diverse and freeing. No one way of

worshiping is the correct way. We'd also like to continue to make each transition within the services seamless and natural. We, Pastor Mark, Jake Petty (Worship Chair), and I are discussing ways to add certain visual elements to the

services in 2016 that are more creative and make us as leaders think outside of the box, in turn, causing the audience to do the same. For example, at the end of 2015 we included a chalkboard with a word or phrase on it that goes along with the sermon. Making time for our worship chair, Pastor Mark, and I to meet



throughout the year is a priority for 2016.

Cleaning out space in the church has also been on the forefront of all the leaders' minds. As the worship leader, my goals at the beginning of this year were to clean out the sound room and the worship closet and donate, throw away or sell anything that we did not need or have not used in the last 5-10 years. We have already cleaned

out the sound closet. A lot of the equipment that we did not need, I organized and listed on Craigslist and various other resale sights. As of today, we have sold \$700 worth of equipment. This money will go into a special fund for our music department to use during 2016!

The most important goal I have for 2016 is for the worship leaders at Redeemer to effectively be used by the Holy Spirit to encourage and support worshippers to approach God, grasp the word of God and to respond to God. We must not take our position as worship leaders

lightly, but see it as a sacred responsibility. The main goal and true reason or motive for serving on the praise team is to be used by God to help people experience the presence of God and feel connected to Him. When we lead we must be committed to both musical and spiritual excellence. But my prayer is that we always be aware that the spiritual is more important and far more powerful than the musical. We are not performers but responders to the Holy Spirit.



The Season of Lent Begins this Month

The season of Lent begins on February 10th this year. The word *Lent* comes from an Anglo-Saxon word referring to the lengthening of days in the move from winter to spring. The season begins with Ash Wednesday and lasts for forty days (excluding Sundays). This is a reflective and penitential season, asking Christians to examine themselves as they remember the suffering and sacrifice of Jesus on their behalf. Significant days observed during the Lenten season include Ash Wednesday, the Sundays in Lent, and the days of Holy Week, including the special days of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday.



Worship Service February 10* 7-7:30 P.M. in the sanctuary Ash Wednesday calls Christians to remember their mortality and their need for a Savior. It is a time of new beginning... putting aside the sins and failures of the past in light of who we are yet to become by the grace of God. The ashes are a sign of both mortality ("ashes to ashes and dust to dust") and purification and cleansing. The tone and atmosphere of the worship service is solemn and meditative.

Redeemer's Ash Wednesday Service will be at 7:00 p.m. in the sanctuary.
*PLEASE NOTE: Our regular Wednesday activities (Bible study, prayer, Redeemer

Kids, and ESL classes) will begin at 7:30 P.M.

Covenant World Relief

Our denomination has a ministry of mercy, benevolence, justice, and disaster relief called Covenant World Relief (CWR). Redeemer supports this ministry. (For example, our "Penny Manna" funds go to this ministry and both CREW and VBS also supported CWR in 2015.) Here is an excerpt from a newsletter showing some of the ways those funds get used:



Project Blue Initiative Provides Access to Clean Water

2015 was a year of special emphasis on the clean water work of Covenant World Relief through Project Blue. In this year, we have created new resources like *Kids Helping Kids: Clean Water and the Walk for Water* to help churches engage in the work of providing access to this precious resource. All gifts to Project Blue go to CWR water projects.

Updates on what is happening because of your gifts include:

In Haiti providing a source of water for one community for the first time and a second community whose water source is unreliable.

In India drilling 8 new open wells, increasing the water availability of 6 existing wells, conserving 60,000 liters of rain water each year, repairing 8 broken hand pumps, and drilling 12 new bore wells.

In Cameroon constructing 3 new wells, providing 40 bio sand filters, and 30 drip irrigation kits.


In Honduras water system is being constructed that will provide access to water for the first time for 106 households and 4 community centers. Each household will also build a toilet and receive hygiene education.

Your gifts to CWR and Project Blue are providing access to clean water for the first time.

Work with Refugees Around the Globe...

In the Jewi refugee camp in Ethiopia, sixty widows and thirty-four children from South Sudan have benefited from a recent garden project implemented by the Evangelical Covenant Church of South Sudan and funded by Covenant World Relief. This garden project helped undernourished women and children grow their own food tomatoes, okra, onions, cabbage, and carrots. One of the coordinators of this program is Priscilla, a widow who bore twins while fleeing from the violence in South Sudan to Ethiopia. Today there are more refugees in the world than ever previously recorded, and more than half of them are children. Because of generous donations from individuals and Covenant churches, Covenant World Relief has been able to engage with partners in caring for Syrian refugees in Lebanon and Greece, South Sudanese refugees in Ethiopia and Kenya Central African Republic refugees in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and internally displaced people in Iraq, South Sudan, and the Central African Republic. HARVEST Community Garden

The Harvest Community Garden is a non-profit organization jointly developed by Redeemer Covenant Church and Keep Carrollton Beautiful. It is open to anyone who wants to do organic gardening and provide produce for a local food bank. We started the community



garden on the south end of our property in the spring of 2012.

We built 12 (20' x 4') raised beds, along with a shed and fence. People from the community sign up to

rent a plot (or half plot) for a year, with the commitment of giving half their organically grown produce to a local food bank.

2015 Highlights:

Looking for gardeners/contacts: Several gardeners did not re-apply at the beginning of 2015. We were particularly sad to say goodbye our master gardener, Sue Hudiburgh, who helped us build the garden. To find new gardeners we posted fliers in apartments, handed out fliers to the Rainwater elementary parents, and set up a booth at Brookhaven College's Earth Day Fest to give out fliers and seeds.

Organic gardening education: One of the goals of HCG is educating people about the joys/benefits of organic gardening and teach them how to grow produce organically. We did that several ways this year:

- Set up a booth at Brookhaven's Earth Day Fest
- Two gardeners went to the Dig Deep: A Community Gardening Conference put on by Tarrant Area Food Bank
- Gardener meetings [2/7, 11/14] and emails were used to teach about growing seeds at home, transplanting, what to grow in North Texas, organic soil amendments, composting, identifying pests and controlling them organically, harvesting how-to's, and more

We partnered with the North Texas Food Bank (NTFB): Since we contribute to Christian Community Action (CCA), which is one of the North Texas Food Bank affiliates, we were eligible to partner with NTFB. We report to them our monthly total of pounds donated and they give us visibility on their website, help coordinate extra volunteers for special projects, and gave us a sign to post at the garden. They gave us sample organic gardening

products and a nice assortment of hand tools.

We received a large donation of seeds from Cindy Baxley who is from Keep Carrollton Beautiful and The Giving Garden.

THE GARDEN WAS MOVED THIS YEAR!

In May Redeemer Evangelical Covenant Church sold the property that Harvest Community Garden was located on. Part of the land deal was that the developer would move the garden. We were told that would probably happen in June, so several gardeners stopped gardening then.

However, the move did not happen until October. (This uncertainty made it difficult for gardeners to know what and when to plant and made planting winter crops difficult. It put a huge dent in our



annual productivity. It also made it hard to recruit new gardeners.) We are grateful for the hard work some of our gardeners did to help with the move.

Food donations: We gave 247 pounds of organic produce to Christian Community Action (CCA) in 2015.

Volunteer hours: Gardeners and garden friends volunteered well over 150 hours cleaning, planting flowers, weeding, turning compost, harvesting, delivering produce to CCA, spreading mulch, teaching and advertising, mowing the perimeter, putting down flagstones, and more.

Our hopes for the future and needs for help:

- · Involve more people from the church and community
- · Cover the walkways with a fresh layer of mulch
- · Increase the amount of food we produce and give away
- Put in a perimeter garden around the fence; build a xeriscape garden; expand with 12 new plots; build a shade structure and a place to sit/picnic/work
