From the Pastor's Desk

So I turned to the Lord God and pleaded with Him in prayer and petition, in fasting, and in sackcloth and ashes. (Daniel 9:3)

When I was a kid watching cartoons a common phrase would occur when the good guys and the bad guys were holding their final battle. The phrase was "prepare to meet your maker!" Either the good guy or bad guy would shout it out before they attempted to kill the other. The implication was that death was at hand and the few moments of life left should be used to get things right with God. As best as we can tell, the phrase originated in the book of Amos. The prophet Amos is warning Israel – who had turned their backs on God - that God would be showing up soon and it would not be pretty. (Amos 4:12)

The earliest Christians had a very different view of "preparing to meet their maker". They called it the season of Lent. They believed the most important Christian tradition was Easter and made Easter the day when baptisms took place. In order to prepare people for baptism, the early church asked them to take intentional steps to focus on God for the 40 days before Easter. In addition, older Christians would partner with baptism candidates in the fast for support. Before

too long, the entire church was participating in a time of preparation. It included fasting, prayer, and abstinence rituals. It began with Ash Wednesday and ended Easter Sunday (when they were baptized).

I've found that both Catholics and protestants struggle with Lent. For

Catholics, it can be a legalistic time with many rules to follow.

Protestants – if they practice Lent - are usually guilty



of tying it to their personal goals rather than God. ("I'm giving up chocolate to lose some weight this lent"). In reality, Lent is much closer to a training montage from a *Rocky* movie than it is to our current ideas about it.

So how about you? Are you prepared to meet your maker? Like the prophet Daniel are you prepared to SEEK your maker? Ash Wednesday is March 1st this year. Instead of these 40 days being about what you give up, maybe they can be focused on what (or Who!) you are seeking?

A Letter from Redeemer's Financial Secretary

As Redeemer continues to create and maintain the "Redeemer Way", the financial bookkeeping and contribution receipt has continued to evolve over 2016 and into 2017. To ensure members understand the contribution accounts and giving options, I have outlined some key definitions and process steps.

First, some definitions:

- 1. Designated Accounts are accounts that disburse the exact amount that has been received/designated by contributions. Therefore these accounts essentially are "cleared" at year-end as the amount spent is the amount received. There are currently 4 designated accounts: (1) Hearts & Soles, (2) Penny Manna, (3) Pastor Appreciation, and (4) Youth Missions.
- 2. Account Funds are annually budgeted "buckets" wherein the money spent is projected to be within the money budgeted. There are 4 funds that Redeemer members can designate contributions to be credited: (1) General, (2) Crisis Relief/Benevolence, (3) Missions, and (4) Facilities.

Redeemer can add/remove these Designated Accounts and/or Account Funds when deemed necessary to the body of the Congregation. For example, if there is a strong desire amongst the Congregation to allow funds to

be designated directly to Discipleship, that recommendation can be presented to the Council who will then decide whether to add that specific Account Fund.

To ensure members have every opportunity to give as the Spirit moves them, Redeemer also has procedures in place to accept items of monetary value (i.e. sound equipment,

supplies, etc.). With evidence of fair market value, the Financial Secretary can provide "Letters of Monetary Value Contributions" to the donating member.

Finally, Redeemer offers the option of giving online through Stewardship Technologies. The online giving portal can be accessed via the Redeemer website.

I hope this overview has provided further insight as to the financial accountability and bookkeeping here at Redeemer. Thank you again for your continued support.

The Season of Lent Begins this Month

The season of Lent begins on March 1st this year. The word *Lent* comes from an Anglo-Saxon word referring to the lengthening of days in the move from winter to spring. The season begins with Ash Wednesday and lasts for forty days (excluding Sundays). This is a reflective and penitential season, asking Christians to examine themselves as they remember the suffering and sacrifice of Jesus on their behalf. Significant days observed during the Lenten season include Ash Wednesday, the Sundays in Lent, and the days of Holy Week, including the special days of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday.



Ash Wednesday calls Christians to remember their mortality and their need for a Savior. It is a time of new beginning... putting aside the sins and failures of the past in light of who we are yet to become by the grace of God. The ashes are a sign of both mortality ("ashes to ashes and dust to dust") and purification and cleansing. The tone and atmosphere of the worship service is solemn and meditative.

Redeemer's Ash Wednesday Service will be at 7:00 p.m. in the sanctuary.

Harvest Community Garden is a non-profit organization jointly developed by Redeemer Covenant Church and Keep Carrollton Beautiful. It is open to anyone who wants to do organic gardening and provide produce for a local food bank. We started the community garden on the south end of our property in the spring of 2012. We

moved the garden closer to the church at the end of 2015, after the land it was on was sold to a developer. The garden currently has 12 raised beds (20' x 4'), along with a shed, rain barrels, and fence. People from the community sign up to rent a plot (or half plot) for a year.

2016 Highlights:

- The garden settled into its new location and survived several rounds of irrigation troubles due to the construction project south of our property and Redeemer's own irrigation projects. (Gardeners were grateful for the rain-collection barrels, as well as a hose from the nearby church building.)
- The beds were filled with new dirt and treated with beneficial nematodes.
- We put up new signs to ask people not to poach produce, but to join the garden instead.
- · We built an asparagus garden.
- We planted blackberries along the east fence.

• We covered the walkways with cardboard and mulch. **New Gardeners:** Several gardeners did not re-apply at the beginning of 2016, but it didn't take long to find gardeners to adopt all of the plots. A Boy Scout and Girl Scout troop each joined the garden this year, along with a couple first time gardeners and some old pros.

Compost: We decided not to do our own composting

this year, because it is very labor and time intensive with not enough product for what the new beds needed. Instead, we purchased 2 bags of compost for each bed. **Organic Gardening:** Gardener meetings and emails were used to teach about growing seeds at home, what to grow in North Texas, transplanting, organic soil

amendments, identifying pests and controlling them organically, harvesting tips, and more.

Food donations: We gave 475 pounds of organic produce to Christian Community Action (CCA) in 2016.

A North Texas Food Bank (NTFB) Partner: Since we contribute half our produce to one of the NTFB affiliates (Christian Community Action), we are eligible to be a partner of NTFB. We report our monthly total of pounds donated to NTFB and they give us visibility on their website, help coordinate extra volunteers for special projects, and provide a sign to post at the garden

We received a large donation of seeds from one of the local nurseries and Keep Carrollton Beautiful.

Our hopes for the future include:

- · Increase the amount of food we produce and give away and involve more people from the church and community
- Put in a perimeter garden around the fence; build a xeriscape garden; expand with 12 new plots; build a shade structure

and a place to sit/picnic/work
