The Master's Touch

From the Pastor's Desk

Jesus replied, "The coming of the kingdom of God is not something that can be observed, nor will people say, 'Here it is,' or 'There it is,' because the kingdom of God is in your midst." - Luke 17:21-22

Lately I have been reflecting on a Twitter quote posted by a pastor I follow. He was offering a helpful critique of the call for Christians to go out into the community, search for needs, and address them. For those who do not know, all sorts of resources are produced year after year to enable churches to learn how to reach their community. This is a worthwhile pursuit and part of our being the salt and light of the world.

But this pastor pointed out something on Twitter, something that put a slightly different spin on things, causing me to think. Here's his quote – if your church reflects the community, you will automatically know the needs of the community before you reach out! Implicit in his statement is a critique: if we are spending a bunch of time and energy figuring out how to get out into the community, it means that somewhere along the way we allowed a gap to separate our churches from the community.

For the messages this spring and summer we will be focusing on Jesus' gift at strategically interrupting. As we go through the Gospel of Luke, we'll see that Jesus was intentional about His mission

(He had a plan to get out into the community!). But He also had an uncanny ability to see the hidden need right in front of Him rather than solely "look out there." He was especially gifted at exposing the neediness of those who think they have no needs. As a result, Jesus did not have to buy a bunch of resources to find out how to reach the community.

Some churches can get caught in the trap of becoming inward thinking and only



existing for themselves. These churches forget Jesus' commission in Matthew 28 to go into the world to make disciples, and they will ultimately die out. But other churches can be guilty of the opposite. They assume the community has all the "issues" without (a) realizing that there are plenty of needs within their own congregation, and (b) they have allowed a gap to grow between the congregation and the community.


What about you? Certainly you are called to intentionally reach out with the Gospel for others. But are the needs always "out there"? Or is it possible the Kingdom of God is in your midst?






Book Club

The Midsouth Conference's 17th Annual Meeting


Redeemer belongs to the *Midsouth Conference* of the Evangelical Covenant Church.

On April 20-21 the Midsouth Conference held its annual meeting in Tulsa, OK. Our delegates this year were Pastor Mark and Jessica Mohrweis. Here are a few highlights:

A few highlights from 2017 are:

- All Midsouth Covenant churches in Houston were affected by Hurricane Harvey. Covenant friends from around the country sent dozens of mission teams to help rebuild Houston and gave over \$300,000 towards recovery. MERGE Ministries coordinated mission teams coming to Houston. The ECC Ministry of Compassion, Mercy and Justice gave encouragement and support.
- We had our largest Midsouth Summer Camp ever in 2017!
- Life.Church started a new campus in Ft. Smith, AR. It's the first ECC church in Arkansas.
- Latino church plant C4 in Dallas (Eduardo Ojeda) continues to develop. Thanks to Allan Serrano, Director of Latino Ministries, for his vision and coaching.
- Our Fall Midsouth Pastors Retreat was well-attended and focused on the importance of Financial Leadership.



- Your Midsouth Board met every Monday evening in 2017 for a Prayer Conference Call. We pray for our churches, our pastors, the ECC and whatever burden the Lord gives us.

• The Midsouth Conference continues to be a leadership conference in the ECC, with many of our leaders now serving on ECC Boards and Committees.

A few goals for 2018 are:

- Plant two churches.
 - Strengthen regional pastor clusters for fellowship and shared mission and develop annual regional gatherings for local church leaders.
- Continue development of our Camp Ministry, adding events that will strengthen our identity and mission as a conference.
- Strengthen Midsouth organizational infrastructure, including board development.
- Strengthening our conference-wide support for Josef Rasheed in his role as Africa Regional Coordinator for ECC Serve Globally.

Several Redeemer members serving as Midsouth leadership: Dr. Willie Peterson serves as Ministry Associate. Jessica Mohrweis and Ron Persson serve on the Executive Board.
