The Master's Touch

From the Pastor's Desk

When it was time to leave, we left and continued on our way. All of them, including wives and children, accompanied us out of the city, and there on the beach we knelt to pray. (Acts 21:5-6)

Every church I have been part of was interested in welcoming new people. After each service, welcome letters were mailed out, phone calls were made, and rosters were typed up. Whether or not we were successful at being hospitable, we certainly spent loads of time and money trying to be. But, at all these churches, I have noticed that we did not spend this same amount of time and energy on goodbyes. That's odd, because I think saying goodbye well is just as important as saying hello.

Redeemer is about to hit a season of goodbyes. A number of families close to us are moving away. Jobs or family connections have called them from Carrollton. We have always had folks who, because of life circumstances, move away. But this summer, in a sad coincidence, quite a few faces will be moving on to new things. We will miss all of them. Even though many of us would rather focus on new faces, I think it's important to say goodbye well.

For one, I think it's important to grieve when we say goodbye. God is present in the grieving process. Some Christians I have met think that a Christian shouldn't be sad. Others think that new visitors won't be excited about the church if we are grieving. Obviously, I don't believe

either one of these things. In fact, I believe if we don't take time to grieve and let go, we will never be ready for what God has next.

I also think it's important during goodbyes to remember the sending nature of ministry. The story of the Bible is one of God sending people to a new place to serve Him. I met one pastor who liked to say that in his church "Our sending capacity is always more important than our seating capacity." These folks who are moving away are following God's call on their lives. We should be excited by that.



Finally, I want us all to remember that goodbyes are often the start of something new. This part is tricky – we don't want to rush too quickly into the "new" without taking the time to mourn the "old." But just as God sends out people from our midst, new faces are moving to Carrollton. Will they feel welcomed? Will they be able to be themselves without being compared to the ones who just left? And maybe most importantly, will they see the love we have for those who are leaving?

Let's say hello well. Let's say goodbye just as well.



Meet Our Praise Team - Curt Swindoll

Share your brief testimony of how you came to the Lord and accepted Jesus Christ as your savior.

I grew up in the church and accepted Christ at an early age. I had several experiences through youth programs where I reconnected with God in a meaningful way.

But it wasn't until I was an adult and my wife graduated with her Masters degree in spiritual formation that I began to really understand what it means to have a close and real relationship with God. It changed the way I parent, relate to others, understand work, depend on the Lord, and integrate my relationship with God into the moment by moment experiences of my life.

This led Debbie and I to start a nonprofit in 2010, Grafted Life Ministries (GLM), to resource churches in spiritual formation. A denomination of 2400 churches worldwide is preparing to adopt our materials as their standard curricula. We are excited to see people around the world impacted in the same way we have been impacted.

How did you get involved with music and what is your musical background?

My parents met through music. My mother played the piano and my father played the clarinet in the Marine Corps. I played the flute growing up and led worship on guitar for my youth group in high school.

I taught myself to play the bass, and we played as a family at home. I finally took some lessons a few years ago which was instrumental! I started playing in a church worship band in California about 10 years ago and have played in several churches.

What has God taught you about your ministry through music?

"Church" took on a whole new dimension through playing. I don't know how to describe it, but the experience of playing was life-giving to me. Some of it is connecting with other people in the worship band. Some of it is simply the emotional experience of playing. Playing is an inward-out experience for me.

In addition, I don't know if other people experience this, but it isn't unusual for the songs we play to be repeating in my head several days later. So playing isn't just a Sunday morning experience for me.



What are your top hobbies?

Well, bass playing is my #1 hobby. I've certainly invested in it more than anything else. People may not realize how much we put into music. If you add up the investment in instruments and equipment and the cost of lessons, I have well over \$10,000 invested in this "hobby"!

I also enjoy reading novels, walking with Debbie, and supporting her nonprofit work.

Favorite music?

Really eclectic. Certainly contemporary Christian music. But my Spotify account is all over the map: pop, classic rock, singer songwriter, Broadway...frankly, anything with an interesting bass line.

(I'd love to play musical theater someday!) Love songs that tell a story and move you. Lately, I've been listening to Progressive Rock band Dream Theater. It isn't for everybody, but it is phenomenal musicianship.

What is God teaching you lately?

Dependence. Debbie and I are in an interesting place personally – work changes, changes at our nonprofit, new ministry partners, selling our home, pursuing funding, etc. Learning to trust the Lord's timing on all of that. Charles Spurgeon once said "God is too good to be unkind and He is too wise to be mistaken. And when we cannot trace His hand, we must trust His heart." It's hard to trace God's hand in these areas. So I'm living in the tension of "trace versus trust" right now. Not easy, but it's a good place to be.


