- Ecclesiastes 3:11

About a year ago, the singer Sam Smith released a popular song called *Too Good at Goodbyes*. The song focuses on a relationship break-up and strikes at what many of us have felt about our world nowadays: We are becoming experts at cutting ties, at breaking off relationships, and at . . . well, saying goodbye.

The song got me thinking about something. Is it possible there is both a "good" way and a "bad" way to say goodbye? Is there even such a thing as a "good" goodbye or are all partings by nature sad and/or tragic? If it does exist, what does a "good" goodbye even look like?

Here at Redeemer we have had to deal with the goodbyes of several friends who have relocated to other parts of the country this summer. I am sure many of you are dealing with endings and transitions in your own lives outside of Redeemer. And it isn't just saying goodbye to people. Even if those in our lives remain the same, the pace of our world forces us to quickly re-think our traditions, our technology, our hobbies, and for the church, our ministries. It

seems like in 2018, you have to be good at goodbyes.

For that reason, we will spend some time in September talking about "good" goodbyes and grieving well. We won't do it to focus on painful memories, but rather to be prepared to face the future.

I do believe there is such a thing as a "good" goodbye.

Furthermore, I think that just saying "goodbye" a lot doesn't

magically make us good at it. A "good" goodbye brings mourning and thanksgiving, closure and opportunity, and most importantly the freedom to face the future with faith and confidence.

The Bible says that no one can fathom all the things God will do in the history of the universe. But we can enjoy the beauty of the things – the people, the ideas, the experiences – we have right now. When the time comes to say goodbye to those things, we can lay them down at peace, knowing that God will usher in the next movement of His Spirit, in its time.


Wednesday Night Bible Study: **New Study!** Beginning September 5th: ***The Gospel of John***




