## From the Pastor's Desk

*Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest. Mark 6:31*

A few years ago, a well-meaning Redeemer member approached me to talk. He had been thinking about some new ideas for welcoming Sunday morning visitors. His ideas were creative and we began an engaging back and forth on how our church could grow in hospitality. As we were discussing our ideas, a problem arose which neither of us noticed. We were talking after worship service on a Sunday morning. As a result, our conversation took place at the exact moment when that morning's visitors walked by us. Because we were so focused on talking to each other, they went right by without being acknowledged or greeted. Our conversation about welcoming people literally got in the way of us welcoming people!

One of the hazards of ministry is when we unintentionally let "ministry" get in the way of ministry. By that I mean we focus so much on what we are planning on doing for the Lord, we miss the opportunities to serve the Lord which are right in front of us. We walk to the big evangelism event at church but forget to greet the neighbor we see along the way. We pray for a great children's ministry, but get upset when the children are loud or messy. We talk about welcoming visitors,

but forget to talk TO visitors.

With that in mind, our church council made a small change this past year which I believe is bearing good fruit. We have committed to meeting not once, but twice per month. In addition to our normal business meetings we have added a monthly dinner together. At that dinner we don't talk about church business. Instead

we focus on each other. What is going on in our lives? Where is God working?

How can we get to know and encourage each other? We want to make sure that ministry of the church doesn't cause us to forget our ministry to one another.

With that said, I would like to ask for prayer. Would you be willing to pray for our church council? Pray not only for our business meetings and leadership of the church, but pray for us – that as we meet over dinner our relationships would grow, that we would experience the rest from ministry which Christ promises, and that our love for the church and for each other would remain vibrant.

I was raised Catholic and attended Catholic mass until I was ten when my parents divorced. My world was turned upside down following the divorce and we stopped going to church. I was angry with the church and with God and wanting nothing to do with either. I lived my life mostly in survival mode. Being raised to be independent, I fought for what I believed was due to me. I wanted things my way and although as a child I was compassionate and caring, I became angry and unable to trust.

I struggled with life in those early years and made a lot of bad decisions. I used work to gain recognition, praise, and honor. Eventually, that led to disappointment and more trust issues. After a period of deep depression and feeling completely hopeless, God reached down and touched my life through a couple of women who lived on my street. I started attending their church and learned the truth about who God is, that there is eternal life, and I needed His saving grace.

I gave my life to Christ on January 15, 2003 and God began working on my heart. Steve and I got involved with Celebrate Recovery at our previous church and through that program I learned how to be the person God made me to be. When that church closed its doors in 2011, we started visiting churches in Carrollton and when we visited Redeemer, we felt welcomed. We joined Redeemer in June of 2013.

Steve and I lead the Celebrate Recovery ministry here, I help Lori in the office on Mondays, and I volunteer once a month in the nursery on Sundays. I have a passion for fellowship in the church and look forward to helping the church grow closer to God and each other while serving as Fellowship Chair. 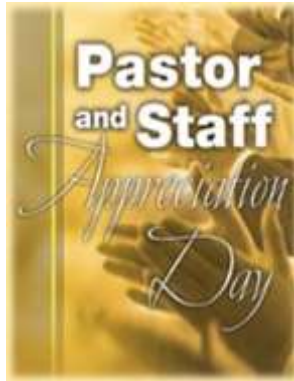
## We are Thankful for Our Pastors and Staff!

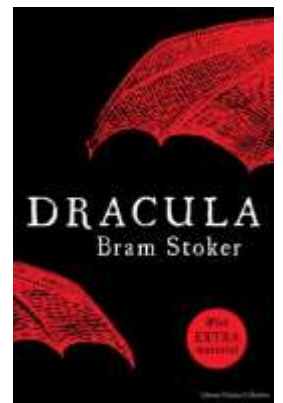

# News from the Midsouth Conference of the ECC

## HURRICANE HARVEY UPDATE

It was one year ago that **Hurricane Harvey** slammed into Houston and south Texas. A recent study estimates that 80% of Hurricane Harvey relief & recovery was done and is still being done by churches. The Evangelical Covenant Church has been and continues to be smack dab in the middle of this good

work. Our Houston ECC churches have been heroic this past year as they helped their own congregations recover and also helped their neighborhoods. ECC friends from all over North America and around the world generously contributed money through the ministry of Love Mercy, Do Justice for hurricane relief and recovery. Dozens of mission teams from ECC churches around the country came to Houston to help. They are still coming. Many of them are housed in Kingdom City during their mission trips.

## MIDSOUTH COVENANT CAMP

Our Midsouth Covenant Camp took place on August 5-11, 2018. This year's theme was "COLORS" and campers



learned lessons about family from the life of Joseph. This year's Midsouth Camp was our largest ever with 147 campers and 28

CILTs (Counselors In Leadership Training)! We had a waiting list for campers, so we are planning on expanding camp next year to include more campers. ## NATIONAL COVENANT PROSPERITIES IN HOUSTON

Sunday August 26, 2018 was the Dedication Service for **Kingdom City**. Kingdom City is the new name for a large church building @ 2100 Eldridge Parkway in Houston, TX that has been basically unfinished for 20 years. Situated in the energy corridor of west Houston, the exterior of this 40,000 sq. ft. building looked impressive. Inside only



about 5,000 sq. ft. was usable. For more than a decade that space was the home of the small, but brave congregation

of Ashford Community Church. Several years ago Alejandro & Vilma Carrizo, pastors of Centro Cristiano Las Buenas Nuevas (an ECC congregation), inquired if their church could use the small space for their congregation. Since Houston, TX may be the most ethnically diverse city in North America, Pastor John Parks (ACC) and Pastor Alejandro (CCLBN) began to pray about a vision for an *international church* of many congregations that could all use the same building. The rest, as they say, is history. There are now six congregations that use the building: *Las Buenas Nuevas (ECC Latino)*; *Woven (ECC Asian/multi-ethnic)*; *Nova Vida (Brazilian)*; *Nations of Praise (East African)*; *Telegu Bible Fellowship (India)*; *Ashford Community Church (multi-ethnic)*. National Covenant Properties provided the loan that allowed the inside renovation of the building, including the new sanctuary. The Dedication Service last Sunday was a *preview of Heaven*. Gloria a Dios!
