From the Pastor's Desk

Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord. Psalm 27:14

The waiting is the hardest part. Recognize that lyric? It's from the Tom Petty song "The Waiting." When I was in high school, my church youth group went on a mission trip to Wyoming. We drove from Seattle which meant a lot of time in the car. At a gas station along the way, a friend bought a *Tom Petty Greatest Hits* tape. We listened to that tape through Washington, Idaho, Montana, and finally Wyoming. As we counted down mile after mile we lived what Tom Petty was singing – the waiting was the hardest part.

The waiting can be the hardest part. None of us likes to wait. Yet it is an essential discipline in the life of a Christian. God's timing is not our timing. For that reason, the church has always emphasized learning to wait. One of those times is during the season of Advent – the four weeks before Christmas in which we balance our hope that Christ will come, with our calling to wait until he comes in God's perfect timing.

I say this because it will explain our non-traditional Advent sermons. (We'll be going through the book of 1 Thessalonians). The Thessalonian church was clearly waiting on the Lord. As Paul writes to them about waiting, we get to listen in and learn how we can wait – and how we can live as we wait. (And don't worry – we'll be reading the well-known Christmas texts in December as well!)

How do you deal with the hard part of waiting? Whether it is waiting for Christmas




Day to get here so we can open presents, or waiting for God to answer our prayer requests, or even waiting for His return, we all are called to wait even if it's difficult. Let's learn how to do a better job waiting this December.



Redeemer's Advent Wreath Tradition

*"For to us a child is born,
to us a son is given,
and the government
will be on His shoulders.
And He will be called
Wonderful Counselor,
Mighty God,
Everlasting Father,
Prince of Peace."
(Isaiah 9:6)*



The season of Advent takes place during the four Sundays prior to Christmas.

Advent means "arrival of a notable person or event" and we use the season of Advent to prepare ourselves for Christ's birth. We have many traditions and activities to help us do that: singing Christmas carols, decorating, the Advent Dinner, etc. We pray that we do not get wrapped up in activities and lose the spiritual importance of the season. To help us focus our hearts, each worship service we will light a new candle in the Advent Wreath, symbolizing hope, peace, joy, and love. Finally, we light the Christ Candle symbolizing the birth of Christ, the Light of the World and the Prince of Peace. We will also have Advent prayers on the Sunday bulletins to prepare our hearts for the coming of our King!

Why the purple and pink candles?

Early in church history, the traditional color of Lent was a deep purple, signifying the royalty, repentance, and suffering of Jesus. Churches lit a candle each week of the solemn season; but on the third Sunday, the church was encouraged to feast and the priests wore pink as a reminder of the coming joy. When Advent was instituted, the church viewed it as a mini-Lent, a time for reflection and repentance (thus the purple). So the first four candles of Lent were adopted and the third candle of Advent was pink in honor of the Lenten tradition of coming joy. Each candle was named in anticipation of all that Christ's coming would bring: hope, peace, joy, and love. The central Christ candle is white to represent the coming of the Light of the World.

In order to close out our books, get a proper financial report, and help our budget committee, we need to have all check requests and reimbursement requests for 2018 turned in no later than December 16.


1. Fill out a Check Request Form (found in the office) and paper clip your receipt and any documentation you have. (Be sure to keep a copy.)



Advent Sermon Series

An Advent People - A traditionally INCORRECT, but theologically CORRECT, Advent sermon series. We will go through the letter of 1 Thessalonians to see how a people who were eagerly expecting the Lord's return were called to act. The implication - we are called to act the same way as we await Christ.

December 2 - 1 Thessalonians 1:1-10 "Advent People: Examples"

December 9 - 1 Thessalonians 2:1-13 "Advent People: Success & Suffering"

December 16 - 1 Thessalonians 3:6-13 "Advent People: Encouragement"
