From the Pastor's Desk

"For My thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways My ways," declares the Lord. "As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are My ways higher than your ways and My thoughts than your thoughts." - Isaiah 55:8-9

About a year ago, a story from a podcast grabbed my attention. The story was of a native Alaskan boy who was able to overcome generational trauma and poverty, eventually being the first in his family to go college. Initially the podcast seemed like a typical feel-good story of perseverance. But the story had a twist: When things in the boy's life improved materially (better school, better home, stable environment etc.) his grades and his behavior got worse.

After being asked to leave his prestigious school ("Not college material" they said), his turnaround began when a new teacher noticed the boy had gifts, but they were not in your "typical" school subjects. He wasn't lazy. He went hunting every morning before school. He struggled with creative writing but was an incredible oral storyteller. His giftedness really came out as he learned how to advocate for other native Alaskan youth with experiences like his. By tapping into these atypical interests, the new (less prestigious!) school set the boy on the path to success. His grades, behavior, and prospects improved.

In the year since I heard that podcast, I've

thought off and on about what criteria we use to grade things. When did we decide that a written story was more important than an oral story? Or that handwriting is more important than hunting (or farming!)? And I had to take it a step further: Are there spiritual gifts and qualities which we are neglecting because they do not fit into our typical "spiritual" categories? I think the answer

to that question is yes.

This fall the sermons will come from Revelation chapters 2 chapters are the letters writes to the 7 churches in

and 3. These chapters are the letters Jesus Christ writes to the 7 churches in Asia Minor. As we go through these letters, I think you'll see as I do that Christ "grades" our spiritual lives very differently than we have been taught to imagine. Could it be that you have some atypical spiritual gifts that are not being seen? Could "Christ's Report Card" list some subjects that you hadn't thought about before? God's ways are not our ways. In this back-to-school season it's worth pondering that maybe His grades are not our grades either.




We provide age-appropriate opportunities for children to learn and have fun during the worship service.


