### From the Pastor's Desk

So, we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal. (2 Corinthians 4:18)

I like to do my own yardwork, but I am not very good at it. In my yard, the plants I intentionally nurture usually die. The plants I am intentionally trying to kill off usually blossom. Years ago, I had a plant on my patio that surprised me. After a spring of doing my best to make sure it thrived, summer won out. The once green plant was a leafless, brown-gray mass. I would glance at it through my patio glass-door as visual proof of my shortcomings as a gardener. I was tempted to throw it away, but I was too lazy. From my kitchen table, I stared at the leafless mass all that fall and into winter.

To my surprise (and humility!), March weather prompted the plant to begin its life cycle again. One Saturday morning I glanced out the patio door and caught a tiny bit of green. I assumed it was a gecko and ignored it. Another splotch of green 3 days later. Before too long, the plant I had known the past spring was back. It continued despite my futile efforts and it continued despite my neglect. Whatever "death" I saw on the surface, life was stirring below, where I could not see it. Every Christian must learn to see that in life, two different realms are operating at

the same time. We have our physical world in which we see all the things around us. But there is also a spiritual world, in which there are things that matter deeply to God, things we might not easily see. During a winter in which we only see the physical death, God is nurturing new life under the surface.

For centuries Christians have used the time before Christmas (Advent) to intentionally develop the qualities we need to survive when we cannot see the life God is nurturing beneath the surface. During life's winters (both physical and

spiritual) it is not our physical circumstances which give us strength. Instead the deep roots of Hope, Joy, Peace, and Love will



sustain us when our circumstances cannot. We may not be feeling very hopeful or loving but that's the catch—we develop these qualities despite our circumstances, not because of our circumstances. This December, when you pass a plant that has shed it's leaves and looks dormant, take a moment to remind yourself that life is still there.

Easter Sunday 2004 God decided I had waited long enough, woke me up and told me to go to church. This time I listened, came to Redeemer and I'm still here. From the first moment, I was welcomed and loved by people that had never seen me before, and I knew my heart had found a home.

In 2002 I became a widow and spent the next few years evaluating my life and preparing for whatever God had planned for me. In 2008 He brought a wonderful guy named Doug into my life, and in 2017 he became my husband. Two years later he is still a wonderful guy and I could not "do life" without him.

Being the Discipleship Chair is the first time I've been on the church Council. The Discipleship Chair works to provide programs and resources that will assist Redeemer members and visitors in developing and deepening their relationship with God. Children and Adult Education is a primary focus. This includes ensuring the curriculum used in our children's classes is age appropriate with content that falls in line with our goal of ensuring that every child learns about God, that they are loved by God and that God has a plan for each of them. 


### **Check Request Deadline**




